Our Projects

Tutoring & Mentoring Initiative—Our goal: Build a public campaign in collaboration with our 30 organization partners to get a tutor or mentor for the 40,000 DC students reading below grade level.

Community Platform Project — Help map community needs and assets and build the website for telling the story of organizations and communities working together effectively, and provide them with an online toolkit.

Civic Imagination — Podcast or radio show focused on local stories of people working together for the good of their communities.

- ◆ Tutor or mentor a student once a week
- ◆ Daily time for reflection and physical exercise
- ◆ Recruit volunteer mentors and tutors
